

Terms and conditions for the EVIST sweepstake

1. Eligibility

The sweepstake is open only to those ecovillages: (1) invited to participate in the survey by the EVIST project, and (2) who fully complete the web-based questionnaire by May 14, 2023.

2. Sweepstakes Period

Entries will be accepted online (by filling in the survey) starting on **April 1st 2023** and ending **May 14th 2023**. All online entries must be received by **May 14, 2023 11:59PM CET**.

3. How to Enter

The sweepstake is entered by completing and submitting the web-based questionnaire accessible by the link sent to each ecovillage. Entries that are not complete or do not adhere to the rules or specifications may be disqualified at the sole discretion of the EVIST team.

4. Prizes

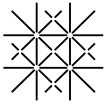
Winners will receive a voucher of CHF 200 (approximately USD 210 at the time of writing) to be spent with: (1) consultancy hours from the list of ecovillage experts available at the end of this document; and/or (2) a course from the [GEN learning platform](#) or from the [CASA Latina website](#). If the winning ecovillage has an expert as a member, they can opt to offer consultancy hours from their expert to another ecovillage. No cash or other prize substitution is permitted. Any and all prize-related expenses, including travel expenses and/or taxes shall be the sole responsibility of the winner.

Where the winner decides to use the voucher for consultancy services, the experts will be paid after the EVIST team receives a report (approx. 2 pages) of the consultancy hours and activities carried out to be submitted by the recipient of the consultancy service. The report must be sent to the EVIST team (rebeca.roysen@unibas.ch) no later than 1 year after the winner has been notified, subsequent to which the EVIST team will pay the CHF 200 directly to the expert.

In case the winner decides to use the voucher on the GEN learning platform or a CASA Latina course, the winning ecovillage must indicate the chosen course within 1 year after being notified of the win, subsequent to which the EVIST team will pay the CHF 200 directly to the GEN Education team or to the CASA Latina education team.

5. Odds

The EVIST team will randomly select one participating ecovillage from each GEN region (GENNA, CASA Latina, GEN-Europe, GEN-Africa and GENOA). The odds of winning depend on the number of eligible entries received. All participating ecovillages from the same region will have the same odds of winning.



6. Winner selection and notification

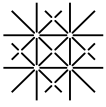
The five winners of the sweepstake will be selected in a random draw performed by the EVIST team. Winners will be notified via email, to the email address that was used to enter the survey, at the latest on July 31st, 2023. The EVIST team shall have no liability if the winner fails to receive notices as a result of spam filters, junk e-mail or other e-mail security settings or if incorrect or otherwise non-functioning contact information has been provided. If the selected winner cannot be contacted for 6 months after first contact, an alternate winner may be selected. If the selected winner fails to return a timely report of the activities as required within one year from the time the award notification was sent, the prize may be forfeited.

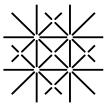

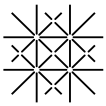

As the Inquiry Facilitator for Te Paparahi o te Raki (Auckland/Northland) – she coordinated tribal claimants and collectives, historians and lawyers, sub-tribes, tribes and key stakeholders to build the capacity in the collectives in preparation for their respective hearings with the Waitangi Tribunal. Thalea studied Kaitiakitanga (taking your place in the world to care for the people, the land and the future generations) through Te Wānanga o Aotearoa (University of New Zealand) – a NZ recognised Indigenous Māori Tertiary Institution. Not only has this qualification enabled Thalea to gain a Post Graduate Diploma in a discipline that she lives and breathes – she has created a Māori healing model integrating core values and practice of her ancestors along with inspiration from her volunteer work in South East Asia (especially breath work and gentle somatic movement).

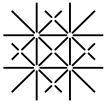
