Las inscripciones serán aceptadas en línea (al llenar la encuesta) a partir del **1 de abril de 2023** y hasta el **14 de mayo de 2023**. Todas las inscripciones en línea deberán recibirse antes del **14 de mayo de 2023 a las 11:59PM CET**.

### 3. Cómo participar

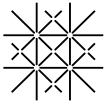
Se ingresa al sorteo al completar y enviar el cuestionario en línea, accesible a través del enlace enviado a cada ecoaldea. Las inscripciones que no estén completas o que no se adhieran a las reglas o especificaciones pueden ser descalificadas a criterio exclusivo del equipo EVIST.

### 4. Premios

Los ganadores recibirán un cupón de CHF 200 (aproximadamente 210 USD al momento de la redacción de este documento) para ser usado en: (1) horas de consultoría de la lista de expertos en ecoaldeas disponible al final de este documento; y/o (2) un curso de la [plataforma de aprendizaje GEN](#) o del sitio web de [CASA Latina](#). Si la ecoaldea ganadora tiene como miembro a uno de los expertos, puede optar por ofrecer horas de consultoría de su experto a otra ecoaldea. No se permite la sustitución por dinero en efectivo u otro premio. Cualquier y todos los gastos relacionados con el premio, incluyendo gastos de viaje y/o impuestos, serán responsabilidad exclusiva del ganador.

En el caso de que el ganador decida usar el cupón para servicios de consultoría, los expertos recibirán el pago después de que el equipo EVIST reciba un informe (aprox. 2 páginas) de las horas de consultoría y las actividades realizadas que deberá enviar el receptor del servicio de consultoría. ## 6. Selección del ganador y notificación

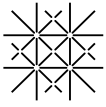

Not only has this qualification enabled Thalea to gain a Post Graduate Diploma in a discipline that she lives and breathes – she has created a Māori healing model integrating core values and practice of her ancestors along with inspiration from her volunteer work in South East Asia (especially breath work and gentle somatic movement).
